THE EXCHANGE OF PEACE



On Sunday, April 9th, we celebrated the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The season of celebration continues for 50 days, through what is known in Judaism as the Feast of Weeks, a harvest festival decreed by God.



During these seven weeks, we remember what God has done for us in the resurrection, Jesus bearing our sins to the cross that we might know forgiveness. The resurrection is about reconciliation, our reconciliation to God through Christ, and also about our reconciliation with each other, as we learn to forgive just as we have been forgiven.

This is what we practice in our liturgy in what is known as the exchange or sharing of the peace. During the past years of pandemic, the practice of sharing the peace fell out of use in many churches but is now part of worship again at New Covenant. There may be those who prefer to continue social distancing, and physical contact—shaking hands or hugging—should never be imposed on anyone who is not comfortable with interpersonal contact; they may simply smile at their neighbors in the pew and speak the words "the peace of the Lord be with you."

In the *Didache*, a very early Christian writing from New Testament times, the Christian community "come(s) together on the Lord's day, having first confessed your sins so that your sacrifice may be pure. Anyone who has a quarrel with his fellow should not gather with you until he has been reconciled, lest your sacrifice be profaned." Thus, the pattern which Christ speaks of in the above passage from the Sermon on the Mount is built into Christian worship from the beginning. It is a word of reconciliation spoken on behalf of our Lord to bring us into harmony with each other.

It is the word of peace spoken by Christ to the disciples as they gathered together in the locked room following his crucifixion and burial. He came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." (John 20:19) He spoke to the fears, the anxiety, the uncertainty that the disciples were feeling on that Sunday, following the anguish of watching him die on Friday and finding the tomb empty three days later. For that reason, we share the peace in our worship. The word of peace from the Lord calms our fears and reconciles us to one another.

The exchange of peace is a ministry, an announcement of grace we make to each other, a summary of the gift given to us in the liturgy of the Word. This ministry we do to each other is far greater than a sociable handshake or a ritual of friendship or a moment of informality. Because of the presence of Jesus Christ, we give to each other what we are saying: Christ's own peace. Then, having been gathered by the Spirit around the Risen One present in the word, we turn to celebrate his meal. Brugh, Lorraine S. and Gordon W. Sharing the peace of the Lord with each other forms a bridge between the reading of scripture and the celebration of Holy Communion, moving us from the word of forgiveness to the meal of forgiveness. When shared in the right spirit, the peace of the Lord truly allows us to approach the altar reconciled to each other and to God himself.

Church Council Meeting


